The dark green foliage turns a brown-green in winter, although several cultivars are selected to maintain a rich green color year-round. Good in groupings or as a specimen, but also makes an outstanding screen as it responds well to shearing, holds its foliage to the ground, and has a narrow spread. A favorite food of deer, it will almost certainly be damaged if the two are in proximity
