



## Bush Morning Glory *Convolvulus cneorum*

A delightful, low-growing compact shrub with silvery, silky foliage and large, white open-trumpet-like flowers from early in spring and right through to autumn. Ideally grown in a sunny and open position, it looks wonderful en masse, as a patio border and tub plant. Prior to flowering, small pink buds appear and open to the white flowers that traditionally have a hint of pink. A lovely contrast against the silky foliage. A native of the Mediterranean, *Convolvulus cneorum* grows rapidly to form a mounded bush just 30cm tall and spreading to 60cm.

Grows best in an open and sunny site, and light soils with good drainage. A light trim to tidy is all that's needed to keep this 30cm tall by 60cm wide shrub in order. Don't be misled by the name - convolvulus. This variety is not invasive, it does not form tendrils, but is a very well-behaved mounding shrub!
