Medium to large fruit. Sweet, juicy, rich flavor - one of the best. From Canada, frost hardy and late blooming; resists brown rot & perennial canker. Self-fruitful. Harvest June 5- June 15. Choice for Colder Regions One of the earliest ripening fruits. Blooms very early; difficult to grow in late frost areas. Needs well-drained, moderately fertile soil. Thin fruit early in season to maximize size and quality. Susceptible to shot hole fungus, brown rot and peach twig borer. Citation rootstock.
