Junipers would have to rank as the toughest evergreen landscape plants in the world. They will grow in any temperate or subtropical region North of the equator, and also in sub-equatorial Africa. Wichita Blue Junipers have brilliant blue. They are narrow pyramidal trees often with several main stems. Wichita Blue Juniper is a slow-growing It is great to use as a screen, hedge, background, or as a foundation plant It is a slow grower, averaging only 6 to 12 inches per year. Given time, it will grow to a height of 18 feet. Wichita Blue Juniper needs full sun. It is tolerant of many soils, and will thrive under adverse conditions. It is a handsome ground cover for beds, low borders, terraces, and hillsides. It can be pruned to retain any size.
